Course Description

This symposium will also highlight evolving role of cytoreductive surgery for advanced gastric cancer.

- Discuss the emerging roles of systemic and targeted therapies in soft tissue sarcomas.
- Identify the roles and responsibilities of members of the healthcare team involved in the collaborative care of patients with gastric cancer and soft tissue sarcomas.
- Integrate a team-based approach in the care of patients with gastric cancer and soft tissue sarcomas.
