3. TEACHING, MENTORING, AND ADVISING

I remain committed to education and mentoring. Third year Georgetown medical students who rotate through MWHC spend 2-3 days per week working directly with me. Their time is spent either in clinic or the operating room during their two week rotation, totaling up to 16 hours of direct contact per week. During this time I am able to teach the basics of ENT including anatomy and physiology, head and neck exams, history taking skills and basic surgical skills. Over the past 7 years I have taught over 20 MS3 students per year on average, many of whom I have mentored or advised to explore otolaryngology. In addition to the GUH MS3s, fourth year medical students pursuing in ENT will rotate with me at MWHC for a full week during their monthlong block. This includes not only GUH students but also rotators from outside institutions. During this time I am able to build on their ENT knowledge and advance their clinical and surgical skills while advising on future goals. Furthermore, I have worked on numerous research projects with medical students that have resulted in publications with students as 1st or 2nd authors which are listed above in my CV (i.e. Martin et al, Towfighti et al, Shearer et al, Walsh et al, etc).

Along with medical student education, I am deeply involved with the education of the Georgetown ENT residents. I am active in the clinical competence committee and application review process. I received the Medstar Georgetown Department of Otolaryngology faculty teaching award 2018 and I remain committed to education the next generation of otolaryngologists. I work with and teach residents of all levels from intern level to chief. I spend 40+ hours per week of direct contact with

residents, whether in the clinic, OR or rounding on the wards. I act as a mentor and advisor for residents when discussing future career goals, research and fellowships. Specifically, I spend significant time mentoring residents who plan on pursuing head and neck oncology, including many recent graduates. I have participated in our annual OTO Bootcamp for the past 4 years, teaching PGY1 and 2 residents about common ENT consults and emergencies. Additionally, I present a yearly grand rounds lecture and multiple didactics lectures covering various head and neck oncology topics for residents and students.

Teaching and mentoring future generations is a large part of my day-to-day schedule and woven into the fabric of my practice. I believe in creating a safe and educational environment, where learners can actively participate in patient care and creating competent physicians.
